But in order to keep growing and reach more people, we need the help of our readers, listeners and viewers.




Case Study #1: Informing the discourse - globally

Case Study #2: Headlines tell the story



Mainstream Jewish media slam Jerusalem Day Flag March

Israel's annual Jerusalem Day Flag March went ahead without incident on May 29, 2022, despite Hamas's threats of violence and hostile Israeli media coverage.

In the lead-up to the event, which celebrated 55 years since the reunification of Israel's capital after the 1967 Six-Day War, Hamas threatened to attack unless it was called off.

Instead of focusing on Palestinian incitement, prominent Jewish publications including the

Jerusalem Post and Times of Israel tried to spin the annual parade as a fringe right-wing event that was spurring Palestinians to violence.

Times of Israel founding editor David Horowitz penned a column under a provocative headline that described the event as a of which described the event as a "triumphalist march by Orthodox nationalist men." Jerusalem Post Editor in Chief Yaakov Katz wrote a widely shared editorial accusing Israel of "racism."

JNS set the record straight with fact-based, accurate reporting.
